
Dec 15- Grade 6 students and Ms Jensdottir will visit Pigeon Lake Regional School for Christmas lunch; details and consent to follow.

Dear Don, staff and students of Lakedel Elementary School,

The snow is on the ground and we are busy preparing for Christmas in the Pigeon Lake area. Pigeon Lake Santa's Elves are getting ready for our twenty third campaign. During the Christmas campaign of 2021, gifts were wrapped and delivered to 180 children along with 86 food hampers. On December 16th MaMeO hall was set up like a huge toy store, categorizing all of the toys to age groups. Each child receives a toy, a book, a game and a stuffed animal. On the 17th, and 18th community members came together and chose and wrapped the gifts for each specific child. Last year over 100 adults and children came to wrap. The next day the food hampers were made up and they were delivered along with the gifts. After the big event we still receive calls for gifts and hampers right up to Christmas day.

We receive our names of families from our local schools, churches, and community members who know of families or seniors in need.

The schools, churches and many businesses in our region have drop off boxes for new unwrapped gifts and we are grateful for their support. Businesses, clubs and individuals are also very supportive with financial donations.

Our region covers from Hwy 2 west to Hwy 20 at Winfield and then south to Hwy 611 and north to Hwy 616. If you know of anyone in this area who is having a difficult time, you may call me personally at 780 586-2518 and they will be looked after. All information of these families is kept strictly confidential.

Christmas can be a very difficult time for many families and we strive to make things a bit easier.

Again this year we look forward to your support. All businesses and individuals who make a financial donation to Santa's Elves will receive a receipt for tax purposes. Bus & Absence Routines



You will notice signage in the parking areas and laneway of the school; please observe them to maximize student safety.

To reduce <u>morning</u> congestion in front of the school—and to avoid bus-car-truck conflicts—we want parents to drive into the second entrance (by the ice rink), 'drop' their children at the east end of the school, and then proceed out the 'main' entrance. We are hoping this will reduce the number of parent vehicles that are sometimes 'in the way' of the buses. Thank you for your cooperation!

As always let us know when your child is going to be absent; use the SafeArrival WRPS app, text the teacher, call the office or write a note in the agenda the day before. We need to know that your child is not going to be at school.

If you are making changes to the bus routine (for example, your child is going to a friend's house) you must tell us. We will not arrange a bus change based on your child's say so. If you are picking up your child at the end of the day, please wait at your vehicle until the buses depart; Mr. Teplyske will dismiss children to you once he recognizes you. It helps if you step out of your vehicle so that we can see your face.


It is so important for children to arrive 'on-time' for school. **Teachers begin formal teaching** at 8:45, but prior to that students have the opportunity to practice reading, writing, and math skills, and to get organized for the day. When children habitually arrive later than 8:30, their learning is impacted.

Breakfast, Snack, & Lunch Program



Lakedell School has a Breakfast, Snack, and Lunch Program that is open to ALL students. Each day Mrs. Leibel ensures students have access to cereal, thanks to the support of Breakfast Clubs of Canada, as well as continued community and private donations. As well, we provide snacks and lunches for students who require these.

The breakfast and lunch programs are intended to support students and families in need, without questions or qualifying information. We appreciate that some families are struggling during difficult times. If you feel your child cannot attend school due to a lack of breakfast at home or lunch coming to school, please discuss this with me: we want your child at school, and will make arrangements.

Teachers have asked me to mention that children need enough food for three healthy (-ish) snacks daily as well as lunch.

Drink Tab Collections

Lakedell School will be collecting pull-tabs again. This project is sponsored by the Lions Club of Pigeon Lake who converts the tabs collected into dollars which are managed by the Pediatric Diabetes Education Centre at the Stollery Children's Hospital in Edmonton.



Indigenous Support Program Lakedell School November 21, 2022

Taniishi or Tanshi (Metis for Hello),

I hope that this newsletter finds all of you and your loved ones well. On November 11 of every year, we in Canada commemorate all those in service and those who paid the ultimate sacrifice protecting our rights and freedoms on Remembrance Day. A part of history that most Canadians are unaware of is how many Indigenous people (First Nations, Metis & Inuit) fought side-by-side with their non-indigenous brothers and sisters in protecting our rights and freedoms. Indigenous people commemorate those lost and those who served on November 8 of every year as well as on November 11. We give thanks to all those who served, those who continue to serve our country, and those who paid the ultimate sacrifice for us in fighting for our rights and freedoms in this country.

Every year in November the Metis Nation of Canada celebrates their history and culture by educating others about their contributions to modern-day Canadian Society. During the one week celebration one of the most important dates falls in the middle of the week as Metis people commemorate the life of their hero and fearless leader, *Louis Riel*. The Metis culture is rich in song, dance, poetry, music, ceremony, art and sports. The Metis people continue to flourish across Canada with one of the guiding principles being respecting the Government of Canada's relationship with the Indigenous Peoples needs to be based on the recognition and implementation of their right to self-determination, including the inherent right of self-government.

For most people, the fall season is a time to prepare for the long, cold days ahead with the winter equinox fast approaching on December 22. The winter solstice is also an opportunity for Indigenous people to reconnect to the natural world, sharpen our senses, and access our most powerful selves. It is a special time for those who honor and acknowledge the patterns of our natural world. In the Metis language, *Michif*, doesn't have a word that translates exactly into "Good-Bye". Instead you say *Mina ka wapamitin*, I will see you again, or *Pekiwke ahpi*, come and visit sometime.
